International Issues and Events

 International Issues and events could require policy decisions to be made by local government officials in response to these issues and events



 Public health concerns. The Virginia Department of Health and its local health districts plan for such threats and take actions to protect the public.



 Public safety in the event of an act of terrorism. This involves all levels of government.

The Virginia Department of Emergency Management has divided Virginia into <u>7 Emergency Management Regions</u>. Each region has a coordinator, who helps local governments develop emergency

management plans.



- Economic development policies in response to the emerging global economy. Today, many businesses locate in more than one country. When a local government stats an economic development project, such as a new business complex, it may look internationally for business investors.
- State governors, including Virginia's governor (Governor
 ______), travel overseas to encourage foreign

companies to locate in their states.



 Policies to protect the environment. Environmental hazars do not stay within national boundaries. For example an oil spill in ocean waters can endanger wildlife in Virginia and other states.

 The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality partners with local governments to protect Virginia's environment and

natural resources

Economic Password
